WHERE TO FIND IT

The Good Samaritan

LESSON TITLE

God wants us to love our neighbor.

MAIN POINT

schedule

Connect Time (15 minutes): Five minutes after the service begins, split kids into groups and begin their activity.

Large Group (30 minutes): Begin 20 minutes after the service starts. Model what it looks like to be engaged in large group.

Small Group (15 minutes): Keep kids in small groups until parents arrive. If you all have extra time at the end, you can review the video and songs together.

tips

Every sticker, every time. That means we check every single kid's sticker before he/she leaves the room, and we make sure that it matches his/her grown up's sticker. This is vital to the safety of kids, and we want adults to know that they can always count on their kids being safe in Kids' Club.

check-in/out

As kids leave, remind them to share their own versions of the "Good Samaritan."

large group heads up

*Here's a special heads up: Today you'll be watching a <u>Large Group Presenter Video</u> in place of a live presenter!





connect time

GOAL: Connect Time is all about engaging kids in an activity that allows them to connect with each other right away, while simultaneously piquing their curiosity for Large Group and preparing their minds for what they're going to hear.

HOSPITAL TAG

*Keep kids in one large group.

- Choose a location around the edge of the room to be the "hospital." Set up *4 chairs* to designate where the hospital is.
- Choose one player to be the tagger, and one player to be the "ambulance driver."
- The tagger will go around and tag people. Whenever you're tagged, you have to lay down on the ground as if you're "sick." (If kids want to have fun with it, they can act like their sick or hurt, with coughing, complaining, etc.)
- The ambulance driver will go around the room to pick up sick people, and take them to the hospital. They have to be touching the sick person the whole way back to the hospital, and they can only take one person at a time.
- When you're in the hospital, you have to do 10 jumping jacks before you can go back out and play the game.
- After 5 minutes, tell everyone to freeze and then choose 1 more tagger and 1 more ambulance driver. Then let kids resume the game, now with 2 taggers, and 2 ambulance drivers!
- Debrief:
 - What was your favorite thing about that activity?
 - o Have you ever been hurt before? Talk about it.

Before you go to Large Group, you can ask kids how their week went. You can also remind kids of the expectations for Large Group behavior: (1) be kind, (2) listen when somebody speaks, and (3) follow the leader's instructions.

script

WELCOME AND INTRO

Main Goal: Review Connect Time and introduce the lesson.

Notes:

*Click to play intro music.

- **Say:** Hey everyone, welcome to Kids' Club! We're so glad to have you here. We're doing something special today that we don't normally do. We're going to watch a presenter on the screen, along with all other sorts of sweet videos! That means I won't be teaching you; the presenter on screen will.
- **Say:** When we have a presenter on the screen, let's remember a few things:
 - <u>Listen</u> to the screen presenter just like you would normally listen to a real presenter.
 - If the presenter asks you something in the video, you can <u>answer</u> out loud!
 - Let's check it out!
- Video: KC Presents / The Good Samaritan

*Dismiss kids to small group.





instructions

Goal: Kids will (1) understand from the parable of the good Samaritan that God wants us to love our neighbors (everyonwo do.

Why? We can love others because Jesus showed us the most powerful love: He died for us!

Tip: Give the kids some ideas for their own personal versions of the Good Samaritan. For instance, they could write about themselves as the "Samaritan" helping someone they would normally overlook.

small group

REVIEW THE STORY

- 1. Why was it a big deal for the Samaritan to love the Jewish man? (Because Jewish people and Samaritans hated each other!)
- 2. Imagine you're the Samaritan. What do you think might have gone through his head when he saw the hurt man on the road, the one who he was supposed to hate?
- 3. Jesus wants us to love our "neighbors". WHO are our neighbors? (Everyone! Our neighbors, our friends, our classmates, our family, and even people we don't like.)
- 4. Why is it hard to love people sometimes? (They don't like us, or we don't like them. Sometimes we want to treat mean or uncool people badly, etc.)
- 5. Who is someone you could show love to this week that you normally don't pay much attention to? What will you do this week to show them love, or help them?

MAKE IT PERSONAL

- Give each kid a story template and set out markers. They'll create a modern version
 of the parable of the Good Samaritan. Have kids think of the characters in the story,
 and replace them with people from their own life. Kids can write and draw the story in
 their own words in the spaces on the template.
- Each box has <u>space to draw</u>, and <u>space to write</u> (to explain what's happening in the story. (See next page for suggestions to help kids get started.)
 - Box 1: Who's someone you know that is hurt or needs help? (In the story, he
 doesn't have to be beat up. Maybe there's something else that's happened to
 make him sad, angry, alone or hurt, etc.) Draw them here.
 - Box 2: Who are the people that pass the hurt man by? Draw them ignoring the hurt character.
 - Box 3: Who would be the Good Samaritan? Draw them helping the hurt character.

- As kids are creating their "modern" Good Samaritan story, ask these questions to get them thinking of what/how to create:
 - Is there a group of people you don't like? Do you have neighbors/kids at school you avoid?
 - Can you think of a specific neighbor you don't usually talk to? What could you do to treat that person with more love?
 - Are you the Good Samaritan in the story, or are you someone who passes the man by?

Extra time? Have kids share their stories with the group.


